

How a Caregiver's Trauma Can Impact a Child's Development

EARLY DEVELOPMENT

Caregiver With Traumatic Experience

Mother releases cortisol

Baby absorbs cortisol through placenta

Can impact baby's:

- HPA axis
- Central nervous system
- Limbic system
- Autonomic nervous system



Caregiver struggles to regulate

Attachment relationship between caregiver and child may be strained

Can impact child's:

- Development of a core sense of self
- Ability to integrate experiences
- Epigenetic expressions

ADULTHOOD

A Person Who Has Had a Caregiver With *Untreated* Trauma May:

•Be more prone to PTSD after trauma

•Struggle to repair after conflict

•Struggle with relationships

•Unintentionally bring out negative behaviors in others

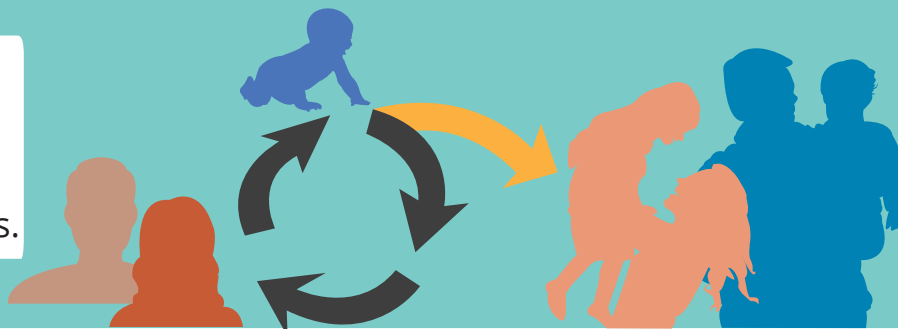
•Be emotionally detached

•Be more prone to dissociate
